The initiation wasn't confined to academic orientations alone. Students visited nearby villages during their week-long orientation program, enlightening school children on hygiene and conversing with residents about critical health-related issues. These engagements showcased the institution's commitment to

holistic healthcare, extending beyond textbooks & clinics into the heart of community.

Symbolism met significance during the White Coat Ceremony, which is a rite at every medical institution that marks their official entry into professional training. Born into wealth on May 12, 1820, in Italy and raised in England, Nightingale defied societal norms that deemed nursing unsuitable for women of her stature. Despite family opposition, she pursued education in arts and science, gaining nursing experience in Germany. When Britain entered the Crimean War, Nightingale, faced with the dire conditions of military hospitals, led a group of volunteer nurses to Scutari, modern-day Turkey, to aid wounded soldiers returning from the front lines. The iconic image of Nightingale with her lamp, caring for the injured in the darkness epitomises the true spirit of Nursing across generations.

GLOBAL HEALTHCARE CONFERENCE

Sathya Sai Grama, Muddenahalli

India's First Free Private Rural Medical College, Sri Madhusudan Sai Institute of Medical Sciences and Research organised a Global Health Conference on the theme - **Augmenting Synergies for Universal Healthcare**, co-hosted by AIIMS New Delhi, at Sathya Sai Grama on 08 and 09 December 2023.



Earlier in June 2023, an MoU was signed between All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), New Delhi and Sri Madhusudan Sai Institute of Medical Sciences and Research (SMSIMSR), to jointly work in undergraduate and postgraduate education in healthcare. Both AIIMS and SMSIMSR will promote and promulgate modules of teaching methodology; jointly work on projects of national importance in healthcare services, with a special focus on primary healthcare, preventive health, and telemedicine; provide combined impetus to augment research and innovation; and enhance scientific and academic collaboration, training, and interaction on healthcare services and medical education.

LAUNCH OF NATIONAL HEALTHCARE HACKATHON (SECOND EDITION)

Hackathon addresses several healthcare issues that the country

is facing today. A healthcare hackathon generally lasts for a few days and involves participants such as doctors, nurses, patients, engineers, designers, and entrepreneurs. The participants form teams and work on a specific challenge such as improving patient care, developing new medical devices, or creating health-related apps...etc. Over 72 hours of the Hackathon Campaign, various students came together virtually to hack technology problems and find solutions, thus using technology as an intervention. Postgraduate students of the Sri Sathya Sai University for Human

Excellence participated in the hackathon.

HACKATHON RESULTS

The 72 hours Hackathon organised by Thryve Digital, Planotech Group and hosted in hybrid mode at IIIT Sri City witnessed participation of over 230 institutions with first day submissions of 131, that culminated to top 20 and ended with top 3 solutions being recognized as top winners. Sri Sathya Sai University for Human Excellence (SSSUHE) received a special recognition for developing a solution to detect cardiac issues using the sound of heartbeat.



Mr Dinesh Gundu Rao, the Minister for Health and Family Welfare, Government of Karnataka attended the valedictory session and expressed his feelings:

Unsung and unheard of Women who have worked tirelessly in remote corners across the nation, for rural upliftment in the areas of Education, Healthcare, Environment, Music and Fine Arts, Sports and Yoga, Woman and Child Welfare, and Unity of Religions were recognised this year. The most important focus of these awards is to recognise contribution made for the nurturing of human values, in which ever field of work, through:

Nurturing values of love, compassion, generosity, empathy, integrity, respect for human dignity, and selfless service

Promoting peace and non-violence

Promoting respect for religion and culture

Uplift of the marginalised and poorer sections of society

Fostering human values in younger generation

The recipients of the Sri Sathya Sai Award for Human Excellence were selected by an eminent panel of Jury composed of members representing the seven

categories of awards. Each of these Jury members is a known achiever, leader and a respected personality in his/her field of work.

This year's theme, "Rural Upliftment - Women of Excellence," brought together seven incredible women who have impacted rural communities across India. Their dedication and determination has touched countless lives.

The Honourable Governor of Jharkhand, Sri C.P. Radhakrishnan ji, presented the Sri Sathya Sai Award for Human Excellence to the awardees. These women are catalysts for positive change, proving that true transformation begins at the grassroots.

EDUCATION

MS MUKTABEN DAGLI



Padma Shri Awardee Muktaben Pankajkumar Dagli is a social worker from Ankadiya Nana, a small village in Gujarat, India. Despite losing her vision at 7, she works towards the upliftment of blind and disabled people. Alongside her husband, Pankajkumar Dagli, she established the Pragnachakshu Mahila Seva Kunj (PMSK) in 1995, devoted to the upliftment of blind girls. “Service to man is service to humanity” is their life’s motto. What started with just four girls in a small one-bedroom flat eventually grew into a five-acre campus, with classrooms, accommodation, and various extracurricular facilities.

HEALTH

MS KALAVATI DEVI



Defying the odds, she built toilets in Kanpur’s slums, improving sanitation in lower-income neighbourhoods. Kalavati Devi was disheartened to witness the inhabitants of her Raja ka Purwa slum openly defecating in the streets, characterising the slum as a representation of hell. Developing her sewer design and construction techniques, she, as the chief mason, built more than 400 latrines in the nearby area with financial aid from the UK-based charity, Water Aid. On International Women’s Day in 2020, Indian President Ram Nath Kovind honoured Kalavati with the Nari Shakti Award, the highest award for women, in New Delhi.

YOGA AND SPORTS

MS PRIYA NADKARNI



Mrida’s founder, Priya Nadkarni was part of a grassroots programme for the tribal youth in Mandla, Madhya Pradesh. Driving positive social change through football training, Priya transforms the lives of tribal children. Under Mrida, the Narmada Valley Football Academy was started in 2017 to provide free education, hostel facilities, food, sports training and equipment to underprivileged tribal children from Mandla, Dindori and Anuppur region. The academy is fully residential and has provided quality sports training to hundreds of children over the years. They also conduct regular football leagues in the region, reaching 1,900 children across 80 villages, many of whom have gone on to qualify for State and National level tournaments. Over the years, this academy has boosted nutrition levels amongst the students, empowered girl children by building their confidence and self-worth, and stands as a lighthouse in the destitute areas.

WOMAN AND CHILD WELFARE

MS BHAGYASHRI MANOHAR LAKHAMI



Bhagyashri Manohar Lekhami is a 25-year-old sarpanch in Gadchiroli district, a Naxal affected tribal district in Maharashtra. A torchbearer for women's rights, Bhagyashri confronts child marriage challenges, advocating for girls' education. To stop girls from getting married before they turn majors, Lekhami has started enrolling them into a residential school. She also helps students in need of financial assistance for higher studies, educates girls about menstrual hygiene, and helps women access basic healthcare.

UNITY OF RELIGIONS

DR MAHE TILAT SIDDIQUI



Dr Mahe Tilat Siddiqui is an award-winning lecturer, teacher, author, poetess, Honorary Member of the Urdu Academy of the State of UP, Lucknow, India and VP of Aijaz Literary Society (Kanpur, UP, India). Transcending religious boundaries, she translated the Ramayana into Urdu to spread the message of harmony. Through her extensive career, she discovered that Urdu is an effective medium to help bridge the gap between the Hindu and Muslim communities. Having studied both the Quran and the Ramayana, Dr Mahe believes that all religious texts carry the same message of unity, love, peace and brotherhood.

MUSIC AND FINE ARTS

MS ARATI HIEMATH



Reviving Kasuti, a native Karnataka folk embroidery, Arati is passionately preserving the age-old tradition. Over the years, Arati has trained around 850 women artisans, of which nearly 200 are currently working with her, 50 of whom are highly trained in the craft. The company also offers five-day training courses to underprivileged women for free. Truly, Arati has been instrumental in not only empowering local artisans but also in reviving this heritage form of embroidery that would otherwise have been lost in the sands of time.

ENVIRONMENT

MS RENUKA KOTAMBKAR



A versatile individual from Wardha District, Maharashtra, dedicated to the betterment of her community. Facing the challenge of water scarcity, Renuka implemented impactful measures such as tap connections, riverbed cleaning, dam reconstruction, and rainwater harvesting and resolved water scarcity in her village. Today, every household in the village has a tap water connection and village women have been trained to check the water quality and its safety for consumption. Her efforts earned her the title of Women Water Champion by the National Water Mission.

SAI SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA PERFORMS AT IIM-BANGALORE

On October 29, 2023, a truly awe-inspiring event unfolded at the Indian Institute of Management, Bangalore, as the Sai Symphony Orchestra, an ensemble from the Sri Sathya Sai Loka Seva Gurukulam group of institutions, took centre stage for the Golden Jubilee Celebrations.
